
Comet Alumni Spotlight Stephanie Schachtrup Coad Class of 1998



Educational Background: I went to St Thomas school from Kindergarten through 8th grade and then on to Peoria Notre Dame High School. I attended the University of Illinois Urbana Champaign where I earned a bachelor's degree in Architecture and then a Masters in Architecture and Structural Engineering.

Recent Achievements: In early 2022 my previous employer, Muller2, an architecture firm from Chicago, hired me to start a Peoria branch and a Structural Engineering group.
