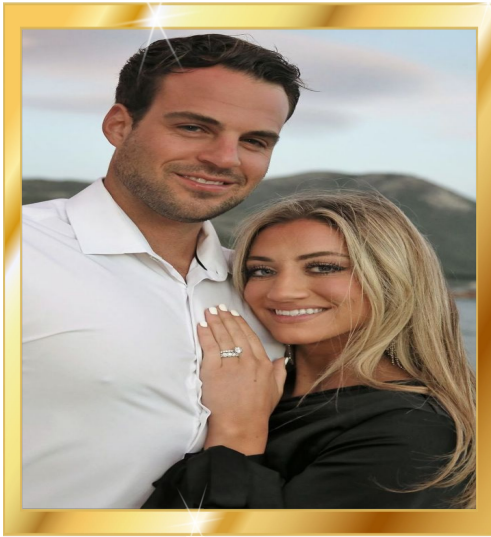


Comet Alumni Spotlight
